This notice concerns the 2020 property tax rates for Johnson County Emergency Service District 1. This notice provides information about two tax rates. The

no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, these rates are calculated by dividing the total amount of taxes by the
